

Spotlight on learning to read!

Learning to read is one of the most important educational outcomes of primary education. The ability to read is fundamental to children's learning, including their development of broader literacy skills, and to their future successful participation in society, including the workforce.

Reading is a complex process that involves both learning to read the words and learning to understand what you read. Learning to read is not easy, our brain is not wired to read so reading needs to be explicitly taught.

To be effective readers children need to learn the BIG 6 of reading ......



**Oral Language** provides the foundation to learning to read. It is impossible to understand what you read without a wide vocabulary.

**Comprehension** is the ability to understand what you read. Comprehension is made up of a toolkit of strategies such as prediction, questioning, visualizing, inferring and determining importance.





**Phonological awareness** is the ability to focus on the sounds of speech and an awareness of rhyme, and syllables.

**Phonics** involves learning about the relationship between letters and sounds. Beginning readers need to learn to blend sounds to read words.





**Vocabulary-** when children know the meaning of a word they are more likely to be able to read it and make sense of it within a text

**Fluency** is not just about reading quickly! It is reading with appropriate phrasing, expression and pace.



Volume of reading matters! So read to your child daily and ask them to read to you. Ten minutes every day will make a big difference. Kind Regards,

#### Dear Families,

If you are eligible to receive payments from Centrelink, such as Child Care Subsidy (CCS) and Family Tax Benefit (FTB), you may be asked to provide your family income estimate for the 2020-21 financial year.

You need to do this even though you aren't currently paying child care fees. This is because Centrelink will use this estimate to work out how much CCS and FTB you will get **next financial year**.
