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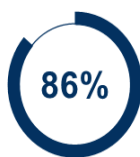

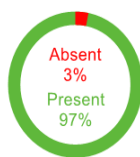

Leadership and teachers use their prior knowledge of students, friendship groupings and the specific needs of your child to place them into the best possible learning environment. We also gather information from children with regard to friendships. It is an involved and complex process to which we devote a lot of time and thought. Parents are welcome to write a short letter about their child's educational needs for next year. This is not a time to request a particular teacher but a chance to inform us of any relevant information in regards to your child's learning, social and/or friendship needs. **Parents are asked to forward relevant information in writing to me by Friday 6th November 2020.**

If your child is in reception to year 6 and is leaving the school at the end of this year, we urge you to please let us know as soon as you can so that we can work out class numbers for 2021.
